



## Community Leader - Public Health Job Description (Part Time)

**Breathe California, Golden Gate Public Health Partnership (Breathe CA)** is seeking 6-8 young adult Community Leaders for its Project E-NUFF public health policy project about flavored tobacco in San Francisco.

The Community Leader position is a part-time contracted position for up to two years. Community Leaders will work in a team led by a Project Coordinator to conduct all aspects of a campaign to engage the community about a recently adopted ordinance ending the sale of flavored tobacco in San Francisco. Community Leaders will learn about public health and social justice, conduct surveys and other research, develop and implement an action plan, design and distribute educational materials, work with community organizations to highlight how the tobacco industry works against public health policies, and learn how to advocate for the health of communities throughout San Francisco.

### Responsibilities:

- Attend regular meetings, about two per month, in downtown San Francisco, with dates and times (possibly early evenings) to be determined by the Community Leaders and Project Coordinator.
- Complete tasks in the project's plan of work, and as agreed by Community Leaders and Project Coordinator.
- Conduct and analyze survey data about tobacco in San Francisco.
- Work with Project Coordinator to convene meetings with opinion leaders and stakeholders.
- Work with Project Coordinator to develop and conduct an action plan to build support for the policy.

Community Leaders will agree on tasks required to receive monthly stipends. All tasks will be determined by the team and Community Leaders will only be responsible for activities they agree to in advance. Community Leaders must be able to commit for at least one year, up to two years, and must be a non-smoker.

### Qualifications:

Community Leaders should have a passion for public health and be: enrolled in a college or grad school, about to attend college, be a recent college graduate of any age, or for those who have not had the opportunity to be enrolled in a college should be in the age 18-26 range.

Those with connections to the **Excelsior, Bayview, Tenderloin, or Western Addition** are especially encouraged to apply.

Ages 18-26 are encouraged to apply. In addition, knowledge of or interest in African American, Arab American, or Pacific Islander community organizations is useful, but not required.

### Compensation/Benefits:

Community Leaders in Project E-NUFF will receive a monthly stipend of approximately \$100 per month, based on project activities, of about 5-8 hours of work per month. Community Leaders will receive training and gain the experience of:

- Developing exceptional research skills
- Learning about policy development, public speaking, and community organizing
- Increasing networking opportunities
